- ❖ Have the child read *Grand Canyon National Park*. Have the child answer the following questions using complete sentences as often as possible:
 - Where is Grand Canyon National Park located? (*Grand Canyon National Park is located in the northwest corner of Arizona.*)
 - What river flows through the Grand Canyon? (*The Colorado River flows through the Grand Canyon.*)
 - Do you think it would be fun to raft down the Colorado River? Why or why not? (*Answers will vary.*)
 - In what year did the Grand Canyon become a national park? (*The Grand Canyon became a national park in 1919.*)
 - Why do you think most people visit the Grand Canyon during the summer? (*The weather is sunny and clear. You can see the canyon well.*)
 - How can you get a good view of the canyon? (*You can hike, ride a mule or horse, or fly in a helicopter or plane.*)
 - What are the walls of the Grand Canyon made of? (*They are made of layers of rock.*)
 - Why do different plants grow in different parts of the Grand Canyon? (*They each have different needs in order to grow. Pines grow on both sides. Spruce trees only grow on the North Rim where it is higher. Cactus grow where it is dry. Few trees grow on the South Rim where it is dry.*)
 - Name some animals and wildlife that live in or near the Grand Canyon. (*bighorn sheep, deer, coyotes, mountain lions, lizards, squirrels, snakes, birds.*)
 - Where does the Havasupai tribe get its name? (*Its name comes from the color of the water. It means "People of the Blue-Green Water."*)
 - What do park rangers do at Grand Canyon National Park? (*They teach visitors about the plants and animals, and they lead hikes.*)
