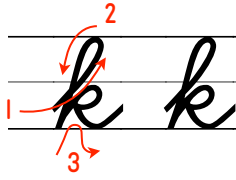

Ants can be annoying when we are at a picnic, and they crawl on our food or sting us. But ants can be helpful to us in ways we don't always see. Ants will eat almost anything, even discarded food that could rot and become infected with dangerous diseases. A colony of ants can devour a piece of fruit in one day. Many species of ants will attempt to eat or kill things that get in their way or that they see as a threat. Ants will eat other animals or insects if they get in the ants' way. Have you ever seen an ant carrying a dead insect back to its home?

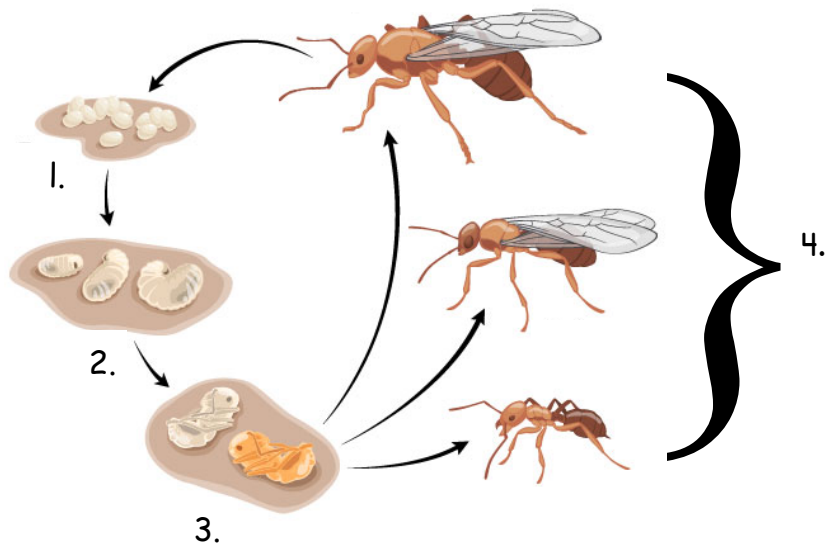


As ants begin to develop their colony and construct their network of tunnels, they move and separate the soil. This lets oxygen into the soil and to the roots of plants.

Sometimes ants help plants by transporting their seeds to new locations. While looking for food, an ant may pick up a seed from a plant and carry that seed back to its nest. Or it may drop the seed along the way. The seed will wait until the conditions are right for growth. Ants can also act as pollinators and spread pollen for flowers and other plants.
